From the Self as Separate to the Self as Ecological

Consumerism (or 'materialistic disorder') which characterises Western culture can be seen to occur because, collectively, we have an 'empty self'. Our cultural project is to 'fill ourselves up' with material goods and experiences in order to satisfy an emotional and spiritual emptiness. As we know, this doesnt work. And precisely because it doesn't work, we keep trying to fill ourselves up with more and more 'stuff'! Just like any other addiction.

This workshop aims to show the benefits of broadening therapeutic modalities from an almost exclusive focus on human relationships to one that includes humans' interconnectedness with the wider web of life, with Gaia.

John will lead participants in experiential and reflective processes that he and Joanna Macy have been developing since 1988. By experiencing and acknowledging our interconnectedness, we create the conditions for the healing of the self into an ecological self with an ecological identity.
